Let's go step-by-step through the process of using your newfound knowledge of color theory.

IDENTIFY YOUR SCHEME. Make a swatch in the grid to the side to isolate what colors you would use in each color scheme for your artwork.

Monochrome would only be one color in many shades, while tetradic would be four unique colors.


BUILD YOUR PALETTE. Use this space to test a few color combinations you imagine using in your drawing.

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TEST YOUR SCHEME. Create a thumbnail in the space below and test out how your color scheme might be implemented in your piece. We recommend making more than one before moving on to the real thing.
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Consider using the "60-30-10 rule," in which one color takes up approximately 60\% of your piece, another color takes up approximately $30 \%$, and an accent color takes up approximately $10 \%$. This can create balance.
